# From the Pastor's Pen

Every now and then, I get asked, "Pastor, what's a good Bible reading plan?" I kind of relate it to a similar question, "What's the best Bible version?" My answer to that question is, "The one you will read!"

There are a gazillion Bible reading plans out there! There are one-year plans (which I was taught in my Navigator days), two-year plans, chronological plans, devotional plans, focused reading plans, and many more. If you've never been in the habit of reading your Bible on a regular basis, start small. Try one chapter a day. If you read one chapter a day in your Bible, you can get through the entire Bible in a little over 3 years! (Three years and 3 months to be exact). What's the best Bible reading plan? The one you will do!

Where should you start reading? Genesis is always a good place to start. In it, God tells us where we came from, what happened to his perfect creation, and how he begins to bring about restoration. If you want to begin at the beginning and then "read through to the end" just be aware that there are some Old Testament books that will challenge your attention span (like Numbers and Leviticus). Maybe after reading Genesis, move to one of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John) to learn more about Jesus. Psalms are always a good choice. In them you read the prayers of God's people, the words of the hymns that God's people sang, and get a glimpse of the struggles and joys of their hearts. One simple reading plan is to alternate back and forth from an Old Testament book to a New Testament book, and back again.

The Apostle Paul tells us that "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work" (2 Tim 3:16-17, NLT). He also wrote, "For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope" (Rom 15:4, NIV). God left us his Word to give us life and hope. As you read it, look for the true hope that God gives in his Son, Jesus the Christ. The Apostle John told those early Christians, and also tells us, "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (Jn 20:30-31). This is the ultimate purpose of Scripture; that we may come to believe, and by believing, have life.

As you read, you will encounter texts that trouble or confuse you. Don't let that discourage you. Keep reading and keep looking for that hope and life that God gives. And to supplement your reading, come to church where you will not only hear it read, but explained by God's grace.

#### Stewardship in the First Commandment

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Cate-chism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety.

Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

The First Commandment:

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him.

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much — and the Bi-ble shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.

In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment:

This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 5–9)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for do-ing God's work.

The LWML Aug. 18 meeting was productive with evolving plans to provide support for Redeemer ministry, as well as fellowship for our Redeemer family. Watch for announcements in the Saltshaker and Sunday bulletin.

Bible study is starting at the LWML Sept. 15 meeting!!

Jeanette Stroming has agreed to lead us in Bible study using lessons printed in the Missouri Synod Lutheran Women's magazine for now. Bible study will be held at our monthly LWML meetings beginning next month, in Sept., from 11:00-11:30 A.M. we will then follow our normal schedule with lunch from 11:30-12:00 and the business meeting from 12:00-1:00 P.M. please plan to attend and partake of food for the spirit and body, enjoying Christian fellowship.

Your Mites at work in Missions, internationally, nationally and in our own WA-Alaska District. This month's focus is Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries - \$100,000 Mission Grant. Redeeming Life currently operates maternity and transitional homes in Central Florida for single pregnant women who are homeless, abused, and/or at risk of abortion. It is a proven model. This grant will help Redeeming Life support a called deaconess to serve in a new location in the Chicagoland area. Additionally the funds will help offset the costs during the first two years of operating a safe and stable home (rent, utilities, food) and provide program services for the women to be served. Redeeming Life's goal is for their residents to learn to live independently and offers many opportunities for the women to understand that, in Christ, there is forgiveness, peace, and unconditional love.

Results in the Sanford, FL home are babies and mothers are being baptized and confirmed in the faith while also meeting their needs for food, shelter, education and basic life skills. Vision for this grant is to expand maternity homes into every district of Lutheran Missouri Synod.



#### August 16th 2023 Council Briefs

Meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m.

Pastor opened in prayer.

Pastor presented a devotional from First Kings 19:18.

July 2023 Council meeting minutes were reviewed and accepted.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: There is a deficit (projected contributions vs actual) grew to \$18,673.33 due to the decline in contributions. Continued discussion on reducing the number of "fund accounts" the church has set up in QuickBooks to simplify monthly accounting. Council members to return next month with their idea of what accounts to keep and why. Won't affect how projects are paid for etc...we just have more than we need making accounting more time consuming than needed.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Adult Bible classes continue, "Pizza with Pastor" continuing to meet monthly studying Revelation. Six pastoral visits made and one funeral service conducted. Confirmands were examined and confirmed.

<u>Elder's Report</u>: Elders discussed the possibility of starting a mentoring program for future elder nominations. The leadership retreat has been finalized for September 30 at the Lynden Library from 9 am – 2 pm. Pastor requested to attend "Ministry Applied Practices West Coast" sponsored by the Northwest District of LCMS. Expenses paid for by District all that is required is a \$500.00 good faith commitment from Redeemer for each year. Council approved this request.

**Stewardship Report:** A congregant would like to explore the idea for an Oktoberfest next year. A Game Day is in the works for the afternoon of September 9<sup>th</sup>, details to come.

**Property Report:** A check was received for \$2,200 to pay for the new rock in front of classrooms from a church member. Hinges for the women's bathroom will be replaced soon.

**Education Report:** Preschool registration 22 total. Classes start after Labor Day.

Preschool playground should be complete by October. Additional play items are ordered and scheduled to arrive end of August.

Gate has been moved to allow access to the west field.

Memorial bench has arrived and will be assembled and placed before the Sunday school picnic/ 5th Sunday potluck in August.

A metal security door with push bar and window is requested for the south preschool door. Requests for estimates pending-Builder's Alliance and Lynden Door.

Christmas program to be presented by Sunday school students on Christmas Eve church service it will include Sunday School students, graduated confirmands and the congregation.

**Evangelism report:** Congregational families with young children continue to receive the Focus on the Family Magazine. This Thursday's evangelism meeting will include the movie "Jesus knew you before you were born" at 1:30 and 7:00.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: In April 2021, when Baker Septic did maintenance on the septic system it was noted there was a broken baffling pipe, which could not be fixed until the old playground wood structure is

removed. Bid was \$868.00 in 2021. Baker Septic will be contacted to rebid the repair since the old wood structure has been removed.

<u>New Business</u>: Tony McLeod has accepted a nomination to the Elder Board. If approved then he will step down as property chairman as another congregant is thinking of accepting nomination to Property Chair.

Pastor closed in prayer at 8:20.
