It's Spring...

Have you ever felt like you were the person in the cartoon with the rain cloud over their head? Wherever you go, the rain cloud follows? You are the only one getting wet, and everyone else is dry? Some people see their Christian life that way. They look at the rain clouds in their lives, and the supposed sunshine in the lives of others, and wonder if God is good.

It may seem like God plays favorites. It may feel like God is good to some people, but right now he's skipping over you. If you if you think that's how God works, you need to turn from looking at yourself, and into your own feelings, and see how God works: both in nature, and his Word.

Look outside. It's Spring! God does not play favorites with rain or sunshine. God "makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Mt 5:45). When it rains, everyone gets rain. And when the sun shines, everyone gets sunshine. The Bible also says, "The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made" (Psa 145:9).

Just like God sends rain and sunshine on all people, those who believe in him and those who do not; he sent his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ for everyone. It doesn't matter whether the person believes in Jesus or not, God still sent him for their salvation.

Look outside again. Whether you believe it or not, Spring has come. The sunshine and rain tell us that God is good. Whether you believe it or not, God cares for you, loves you, sent his Son for you. Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and ascension tell us that God is good. That's what God's Word tells us. Believe it. Then through faith, you will learn that no matter what rain clouds come your way, God's Son, your Lord Jesus Christ will still shine in your life.

#### **Council Minutes April 11, 2023**

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 by President Les Anderson.

Pastor Watt opened with prayer and a devotion from Matthew 28:9-10 where Jesus told the women that first Easter morning not to be afraid.

The previous month's minutes were reviewed and accepted as written.

**The Treasurer's report** was presented, and Carl briefed the Council on an error he made in the budget presentation to the congregation at the January meeting. Inadvertently left out of the budget numbers was the amount being paid to Concordia Plan Services for Pastor Watt's benefits. Carl will brief the congregation in a letter. That added expense, and less than anticipated offering income for January through March reveals an operating shortfall of approximately \$4,000.00.

**Pastor** reported on services conducted, visits made, and other pastoral acts. Three out of four Confirmation classes were held (one canceled for voter meeting). Average attendance: Jan (60); Feb (53); and Mar (60).

Pastor presented **Elder's** report (in Rod's absence). Elder's working on slate of officers for Council positions, and three Elder positions. Recommending compensation for Shannon Kimes as she learns and fills in as organist for Dee.

**Stewardship** reported there were approximately 50 people at the Easter Sunday breakfast. Easter attendance was 84. A Mother's Day brunch is being planned at church with the Elder's serving. National Day of Prayer planned for May  $4^{th}$ .

**Property** reported that the exterior lighting upgrade has been approved and work will begin in a week or two. Exterior lights will be converted to LED and a PSE grant has been approved. A Spring outdoor clean-up morning will be scheduled for April 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Education** reported that the new preschool playground equipment is scheduled to be installed this month.

**Evangelism** reported on the material and supplies available from Lutherans for Life have been shared with the preschool and will be available for the congregation.

**Unfinished business:** The Council approved participation in the LCMS National Offering to be collected before the Synod Convention in late July. Monies collected will be used to publish and provide Lutheran theological material in languages other than English. Also, an application has been made with Fred Meyer for Redeemer to participate in their Community Rewards Program.

**New business:** Ross would like to schedule a presentation about Lutheran Hour Ministries to the church. Pastor and Ross will coordinate.

#### **Follow Him in Generosity**

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. "For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you" (John 13:15). We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God, that job's already done! But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow His example of generous giving. And Jesus' generosity is not merely an example. Our Lord also commands us to act according to our gifts: "The one who contributes, [let him give] in generosity" (Rom. 12:8).

So, when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. We should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an after-thought — He gave according to the plan of salvation God established from the foundation of the world. So, when it comes to our own offerings, we should make a thoughtful plan to give generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability, and even beyond their ability (2 Cor. 8:3), we should honor the Lord by giving a generous portion of the income that God provides us.

We should also give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. We do not give grudgingly, but willingly and cheerfully, each "as he has decided in his heart," as the Lord says (2 Cor. 9:7). There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us!

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of our love for Him and for our neighbor. Jesus shows us that genuine love is always love "in deed" (1 John 3:18). It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we support His Gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously to construct and support the operation of the tabernacle, for that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly, so abun-dantly they had to be told to stop giving! (Ex. 36:5–6). In the same way, we should bring gener-ous offerings to support the Lord's work. We support our congregations in the preaching of His Word,

Baptism and the Lord's Supper, which bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation, and we take care of those who are poor and needy.


Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.

#### **Prayer Quilts**

Many churches have quilting ministries. Some combine these with a prayer ministry as well. Prayer is powerful.

If you are in a quilting ministry, keep your focus on the recipient of the quilt. Remember why you are making it. One resource available for ideas is www.prayerquilting.org.

Prayer quilts may be small or large, simple or complex. More important than how the quilt is made, is the prayer lifted up on behalf of the recipient. Some quilters prefer to tie their quilts rather than sew the layers together. A prayer for the recipient covers each lovingly tied knot. The recipient can rest assured that untold number of prayers are covering them.

Our scriptural mandates to bring everything to God in prayer are serious. How serious are we to live a life of faith that pleases the Lord and endures until the end?

God makes His intention and passion clear in the book of Isaiah: "Before they call out I will answer. Before they finish speaking, I'll have heard." If He would do that for a nation, how much more will He hear and answer for whom His Son died?
