# From the Pastor's Pen

Pentecost is upon us. It marks the beginning of the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the church year, sometimes called Ordinary Time, Sundays after Trinity, or the Time of the Church. In contrast to the 1<sup>st</sup> part of the church year, the Festival half, which focuses on the life of Christ and what he has done to save us; the second half focuses on the Church's response to what Christ has done for us. After celebrating the birth, life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, we now settle into a time for us to reflect more deeply about what all that means for us; how we as Christians ought to respond to the love that God has shown us.

For many Christians, Pentecost conjures up a focus on such things as the miraculous. While there were some pretty miraculous things happening that first day of Pentecost, and in the early part of the Book of Acts, these things were not the primary mission, or ministry, of the church. As Luke closed out his Gospel account, he wrote, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high" (Lk 24:46-49); and he opened his second volume, the Book of Acts with, "[Jesus said to them] wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now, [and] you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:4-5, 8). When the Day of Pentecost came, we saw the initial fulfillment of those words of Jesus.

Oh yes, there was wind, fire, and tongues. But those were not the message... they were only signs to get people's attention. Peter's Pentecost Day sermon was the message, and he preached the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, which is what touched the hearts of his hearers. "Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself. And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls" (Acts 2:37-41). That's what Pentecost is all about!

That is also what the Church is about. Paul wrote to the Corinthian believers, "Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the

wisdom of God (1 Cor 1:22-24), and to the Romans, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek" (Rom 1:16).

And this is what Redeemer is about. The proclamation of the gospel, which is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes: you, your family, and your neighbor. God has poured out his love on you. He has sent his Son for the forgiveness of your sins, and given you his Holy Spirit in your baptism. You have the same Holy Spirit as those early disciples. May God use us as he used those early disciples to share that love with those around us.




























### **Council Minutes May 16, 2023**

Pastor opened in prayer.

Pastor presented a devotional from 1st Peter 3:18

### April 2023 Council Minutes were reviewed and accepted.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: There is a budget shortfall due to a reduction in tithes and donations. Council voted to have the church and the preschool accounting systems on the same fiscal year to simplify accounting for both. The council approved the following: paying the head of preschool operations a 20 percent bonus on the remaining balance of the preschool fund account at the end of the fiscal year to promote saving money etc... If there is not a surplus there will not be a bonus and the church will pick up the deficit. 75% of any preschool end of year surplus is to be moved to the church's general fund. Carl also asked to move 75 percent of the remaining Preschool fund balance after the bonus to the general fund of Redeemer Lutheran church at the end of every calendar year.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor held three confirmation classes, pastoral care consisted of: 1 individual counseling session, 1 phone call session, 1 home visit, 1 shut in visit, and a graveside service. Pastor is in the final stages with Course 15 of SMP training. Summer intensive at St. Louis will be in early June.

<u>Elder's Report</u>: Doug Bender has agreed to be on the ballot to hopefully be elected to Elder Board. Most of the council positions have been filled with the exception of the Vice President, and Stewardship.

A local Ukrainian church body has requested to use Redeemer's facilities to start a new church. After consideration, the Elders recommended to deny the request. Council voted in agreement with the Elders and the request will be denied.

<u>Stewardship Report</u>: For Father's day there will be a cake and Dad snacks. There will be a fifth Sunday potluck in July, and if there is VBS a potluck will be held at the end of VBS.

<u>Property Report</u>: All of the exterior LED lights and fixtures including the parking lot have been installed. There is a bare counter in the preschool that needs a surface (Formica for example) and there is a need for more cubbies, which a member has volunteered to complete this summer.

<u>Education Report</u>: VBS materials are already here and are being reviewed, volunteers are needed; requests will be in the Saltshaker. The Board of Education has reviewed the Sunday School curriculum and decided there was not a need to order new supplies. Everything has been organized and assembled for September thru December. The preschool play equipment is installed.

Evangelism report: Pastor Watt reported there is an evangelism meeting this Thursday at 1:30 and 7.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: Mount Baker lawn service is coming on a month to month basis for now.

<u>New Business</u>: Pastor reported that he and Dee had a young adults meeting at their home, and everyone was excited and would like to get together once a month.

There will be a voters meeting on May 21<sup>st</sup>, installation of officers will be June 11<sup>th</sup>.

Pastor closed in prayer at 8:10 pm.


#### MISSION GRANT - YOUR MITES AT WORK

Lutheran Heritage Foundation continues its work of translating, publishing, distributing, and introducing Lutheran materials throughout Africa. Christian missionaries continue to spread the Light of the Gospel. The missionaries may be forced to leave the country but the Lutheran books stay behind.

This \$100,000 grant will introduce children to Jesus in their Lutheran schools, Sunday schools, and orphanages. By the end of preschool, every child knows the 10 Commandments, the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer. LHF is able to print catechism booklets for less that 50 cents each. Beautiful, full-color Bible storybooks can be produced for less than \$3 per child. The Holy Spirit will use your gifts to share Jesus with tens of thousands of children.







### What Do You Want?

One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.


When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiv-ing His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pas-tures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the busi-ness of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.
